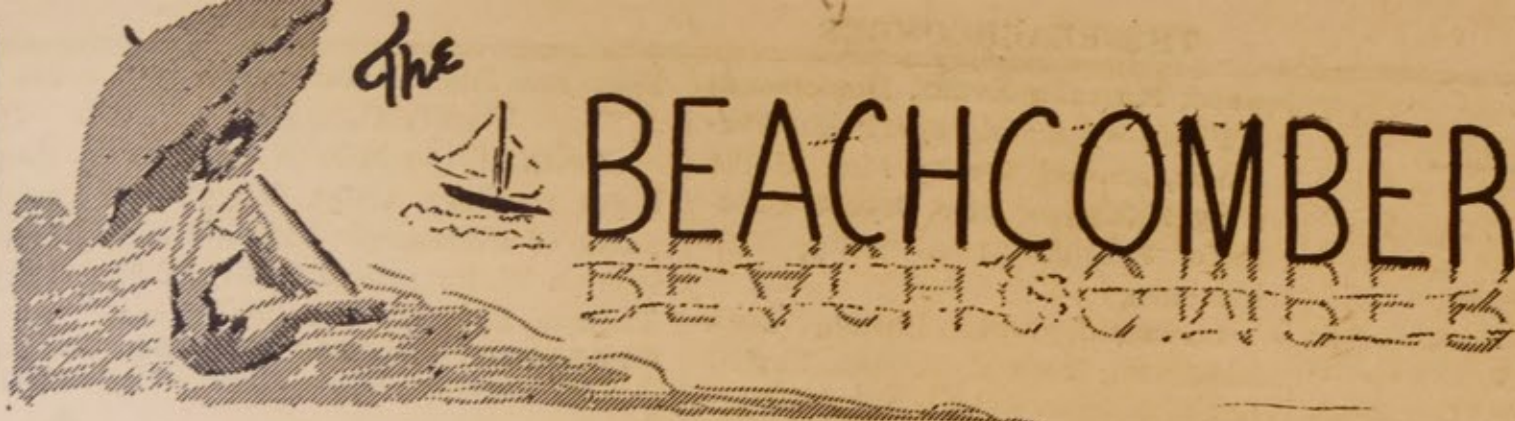

## Regners Purchase Cleveland Inn Property From Banigs

The property deal involving the sale of Cleveland Inn and lakefront property known as Land-O-Sand by the Walter Banig family to Mr. and Mrs. William E. Regner, owners of Crest Court, has been completed, it was announced here this week.

Last week a property transaction was completed in which the Banigs purchased Maple Manor hotel, annex and cottages from E. V. Goettel.

The Cleveland Inn property includes the hotel, three cottages (Happy Hours, Flo-Walt, and Mary-Pop), a garage and two parking lots located near the hotel, and Land -O-Sand (four cottages and the Banig winter home).

Regner, who has operated Crest

Court for the last ten years, said that he did not have any plans for the property this year and that they would take possession Sept. 15.

## Council Takes Action To Cut Off Lake County

The Geneva-on-the-Lake council has requested the Ashtabula County commissioners to proceed to notify Lake County commissioners of the termination of the water contract.

The action was a result of a unanimous vote by councilmen at last Monday night's meeting. At an earlier meeting this year they had instructed Village Solicitor Lyle Merritt to request the county commissioners to terminate service with a year's notice.

A clause in the agreement entered into between the two counties when the 19-mile 10-inch main was extended from the Ashtabula terminal point at the county line to the Perry township line in Lake county, permits Ashtabula county to cut off services with a year's notice.

## Mayor Murray Cook Declines To Run

Two local men filed petitions as candidates for the office of mayor at Geneva-on-the-Lake with 16 other names on petitions seeking other non-partisan offices when the deadline for filing nominating petitions for the Nov. 4 election was reached.

Although urged to run again for his present office of mayor, Murray Cook declined to run saying that he was just finishing his fourth year in that office and that he had previously served as councilman. "I feel it is someone else's turn," he commented.

He expressed a desire to retire from active politics but added that he would "still have the interest of the village at heart," and that he appreciated the cooperation he was receiving in office.

The two men filing for mayor are George Konold, councilman and owner of Snell's Midway, and Carl G. Madsen, of Mapleton Beach who is owner of the Madsen Doughnut shop here.

John Zimmerman will run unopposed as village clerk, as will M. K. Koerner for treasurer.

On the school board slate are Alice Zimmerman, Katherine M. Davis, and Clara Spencer Jolly.

Running for the council will be Martha Pera Woodward, Art Taylor, L. A. Paul, A. T. Lomas, J. C. Linhart, W. L. Harper, Alfred S. Oakley, C. E. Jolly, Glenice E. Cook, Louis B. Dellabarca, and E. R. Rose.

## Village Property Tax Rate Lowered

Tax rate on property at Geneva-on-the-Lake has been lowered for 1948, according to John Zimmerman, village clerk, who attended a budget hearing in Jefferson Wednesday.

The rate set for 1948 will be 16.80 in comparison with 17.70 this year. The lower rate was partially because of the increased property evaluation here, Zimmerman said.

A breakdown of the rate listed the county as receiving 2.52; township, .58; village, 4.40; and school, 2.50. Outside the 10 mill levy 6.80 was set for debt purposes.

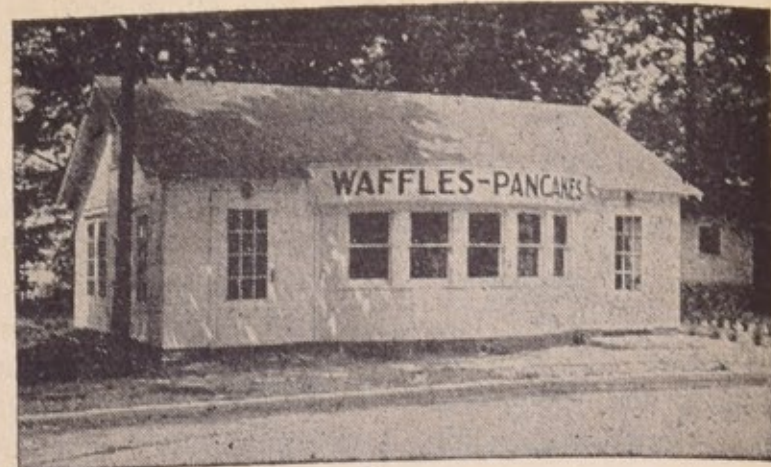

**A Real Deep Sea Fisherman**  
When you're down renting a canoe, rowboat, raft—or maybe buying a boat—at F. W. Lomas', ask the Missus to show you that big head in one of their new cottages!  
No, it's not one of those shrunken human heads from the heart of Africa, nor is it the head of a wicked-looking boa constrictor! It's the mounted head of a 250-pound turtle which Lomas himself speared out on the Gulf stream in Florida.  
"But that was just a little one," Lomas laughed. "Some of those sea turtles weigh up around 800 pounds."

Lomas can tell you quite a bit about deep sea fishing. He has a 26-foot cabin boat, "My Partner," which he uses to take out fishing parties during the winter months off West Palm Beach.  
He has caught everything from the big marlin prize catches down to the regular run of amberjack and King fish, but he says that the big red snappers or Wahoo will give you the toughest fight.  
The Lomas-es have named their new cottages after their two children, "Jerome" and "Donald."

They hit the other car broadside. The girl was thrown through the windshield. Her foot was crushed. The fellow received severe lacerations. BUT, considering everything, they were lucky to be alive.  
It doesn't help much to talk, or to preach, but maybe some of you folks planning to come up here, or some of you folks going home will read this and stop a moment and think!  
PLAY SAFETY FIRST. You may get there faster if you drive seventy-five or eighty, but then again, you might not get there at all! Since a good many times "it's the other guy," keep your car under control. Don't keep at the wheel to the point of exhaustion. Let someone else take over. PLAY SAFETY FIRST!
