beautifully landscaped.




### Bus Resumes Service Between Resort, Ashtabula

The Lake Road Transit company resumed their bus schedule last Tuesday after being off the road for five days because they lacked insurance coverage.

The service was discontinued because of the bus company's insurance firm in Pennsylvania, but now the transit company has received full coverage and is resuming normal operations.

Clarence Brown, bus official, said that the company expected to purchase another bus and that they planned to run between the resort and Geneva early in the fall.

### Resort School Board Asks For More Funds

The Geneva-on-the-Lake Board of Education asked for \$6,000 operating expenses in comparison with \$5,000 requested last year when they met recently for a budget hearing.

The increased amount is due largely to the influx of school children in this district and an increase in transportation costs, school officials said.

Only a small number of school districts in the state are similar to the village school district here in that there is no school in the district and that school children here attend Geneva schools by the pay-

ing of a tuition.

According to recent figures, 16 from here attend the East Geneva school; and 35 attend the city school. In January the grade school tuition was raised from \$4.75 to \$5.19 and high school tuitions were lowered from \$13.73 to \$11.79. The figures are set each year in accordance with the average daily attendance.

### Costs Increased

Transportation costs were increased from \$7.75 to \$12 a day, paid to A. D. Nichols, of Woodbine cottages, school bus driver.

Nichols recently purchased a

new school bus at a cost of \$3833.30 and it must be pointed out that he not only furnishes the bus but provides a garage and also maintains the bus.

Mrs. Alice Zimmermas was named president of the board at a meeting in February, succeeding Mrs. Eva Nichols who has served as president for 11 years.

Other officers include Mrs. Wade Blough, of Palmetto Beach, vice-president; Mrs. Katherine Davis of Shoreland cottages; Mrs. C. E. Jolly of Youngstown Manor; and Mrs. Nichols. James W. Simmons, Geneva attorney, is clerk.

## More People Playing Golf!

Tennis has always been our dish, but like hundreds of other typical Americans, we have been bitten by that early Sunday morning golf "bug" and begin to wish fervently (after losing the fifth ball) that we had taken up the game in early childhood!

And, after seeing the crowds on the greens one week-day, we have just about decided to throw in our vote for an 18-hole golf course at Geneva-on-the-Lake, say starting in 1951 when the village will be out of debt!

Looking at it from the golfer's viewpoint, a game consists of eighteen holes—nine holes really isn't a game. At the time that the course was laid out in 1925, nine holes was sufficient, but since that time golf has been an increasingly popular game and with the resort's expansion noticeable each year, we contend that the village needs an eighteen-hole course.

We asked the local golf pro, John Evans, about it and quite naturally he was all for it. He said that the present equipment could take care of an eighteen-hole course as easily as it now takes care of the nine-hole course. Of course, more labor would be required, but then, an eighteen-hole course would bring in just that much more revenue to the village.

One is constantly amazed at the small communities that support municipal golf courses, and incidentally, there are numerous resorts along Lake Erie that have eighteen-hole golf courses. The present nine-hole course, filled with natural hazards, is an excellent one and is praised by all who come to play. And with the present acreage owned by the village adjoining the course, little more land would be needed for an eighteen-hole course.

The "fly in the ointment" would be the initial cost required and with current prices, it would be difficult to estimate just what that cost would be, but perhaps within the next several years the picture will change and the village will see its way clear to shoulder the cost.

Certainly, it would be far more advantageous for the village to put in another nine holes than to have private interests, perhaps, put in a separate eighteen-hole course. And, of course, there is always that possibility.

There are many improvements that can be made on all resorts and everyone is entitled to his own opinion on what ought to come first. There also is the danger of "over-expansion," but that would not apply to an additional nine holes, because the need is evident. It remains a matter of "first things first."

# Indian Creek Named After "Little John"

"The sun is setting; a large disc of hammered gold, it glows through the spreading elm and pine. An Indian runs swiftly along the shore of the great lake, his strides as rhythmic as those of the forest deer. At the mouth of a creek he comes to a halt. Nearby stands his wigwam..."

This quote is taken from an article written by William Diehl in the 1935 Directory of Geneva Village and township and Geneva-on-the-Lake compiled and published by the Atlas Publishing Co. in Madison. The editor borrowed the directory from Mrs. Lawrence Paul of Palmetto Beach.

Diehl points out that the Indian is a Chippewa having strayed with a few other braves from his tribe that resides near the Sault De St. Marie. His English name is Little John, Diehl writes, and he is there for the triple purpose of trapping, hunting and fishing. The nearest white inhabitants are located at Harpersfield several miles away.

His wigwam stands on Indian Creek which flows into Lake Erie just east of Palmetto Beach.

Diehl reports that in 1806 two or three Indians appeared at Major Morse's at the Harpersfield settlement and all were painted black for mourning. The white men followed them and soon discovered the cause for their grief.

Little John had been killed while

chopping down some trees. The whites stayed for a short time and helped to bury the good Indian, erecting a monument of wooden slabs over the grave and in his memory the creek was named "Indian Creek."

On March 16, 1816, Geneva was set off from Harpersfield and incorporated. In April of that year, the first township meeting was called.
